 Increase competences in the implementation of research, social and technological innovation projects


- Increase employability of young graduates as project managers in these kinds of projects

WP3: Network&Roadmap


Network was used to <u>map the missing skills & competences concerning project management</u>:

- Desk research in 14 countries
- 51 best case practices on PM
- Danube Region-wide survey: 996 replies
- Around 200 interviews



WP4: Curriculum (Lead: CUNI, CZ)

Based on the needs analysis and partners' expertise, a draft curriculum was developed consisting of 5 modules.






WP4: Curriculum (Lead: CUNI, CZ)
